What's Happening in Our Classrooms

Elementary Special Needs – Mrs. Jessica Jaruczyk

In September, we have been working to help our new students adjust the classroom teachers, aides, transitions and routines. The students who go into the general education classrooms are working on learning how to work in a larger classroom environment and follow a class schedule. To help prepare our students for the general education classrooms, we are reinforcing skills such as: following directions, quiet mouths and bodies. Students in the LSS class work with individual activity schedules to help meet their needs. All of our students have been given preference assessments to see what items and activities are reinforcing so that they can be used as motivators. Our basic ABA programs have started.

Kindergarten – Mrs. Suzanne Livelli, Mrs. Kristy McCabe and Mrs. Kimberley Nochimson

5-4-3-2-1 BLAST OFF! We have another AWESOME group of kindergartners filling up KL, KM and KN this year! We are incredibly proud to say that all of the children are walking down to class all by themselves each morning and quickly adjusting to kindergarten life! We spent the month getting familiar with our school and all of the super teachers within it. We are learning all of the important rules to keep us safe and help us be the best we can be each and every day! We played lots of fun games to get to know our amazing new classmates. We are realizing that there is so much to learn and that we must always have our listening ears on! We were mathematicians counting everything we could get our hands on! We practiced our fine motor skills with lots of coloring, cutting and gluing. We have been observing the beauty of the change of season as we happily welcomed fall. We graphed our favorite season and our favorite apple too! We also wrote about our favorite things to do in the fall! Each day is a brand new adventure in kindergarten! We cannot wait to watch our littlest Laning learners grow!

Grade 1 - Mrs. Nancy Apisa and Mrs. Kristina Ellenbogen

The First Graders are off to a super start at Laning. We have launched ourselves into Reading Workshop and have been learning all about the important workshop procedures that make our classrooms run smoothly. Recently, we read the book, BORN TO READ, by Judy Sierra, and we practiced making connections from our lives to this story. In writing, we are stretching our stories, learning to sketch and label more vigorously during our writing process. The strange sounds emanating from the First Grades are not to be feared but to be encouraged. It is merely the sound of children writing...invented spelling during Writing Workshop is in full swing, and the children are sounding out everything!

We have begun a weekly fluency exercise where we practice reading one poem for several days in order to read more smoothly. It's so exciting! Plus, we've been practicing our handwriting and letter sounds daily.

Through games and manipulatives, the students are building math awareness and math skills. We have already completed our first math topic on understanding addition, and the children have been very busy with subtraction, too. The children are being prepared for the concepts which will be introduced this year.

The school year is off to a great start!

Grade 2 - Mrs. Banta, Ms. Jennifer Kirby, and Mrs. Sage Nardi

The second graders were eager to start a new school year and have been adjusting to their new routines. They spent the first week of school getting to know one another through a series of morning meetings and getting to know you activities.

Students spent the first month of school reviewing addition concepts in math and launching their first writing workshop unit. They were very excited to continue writing workshop from first grade! In social studies, students have been learning how to use their new materials, such as atlases and maps. In science, they have been learning how scientists use their five senses to help with investigations. They then put those senses to work in a series of investigations involving pennies.

The newest addition to the second grade curriculum is reading workshop. Students learned about who they are as readers and how that impacts their choice in books. They had a great time interviewing a parent at home about their childhood reading memories. They also learned several strategies that readers use to help them understand text. Students are working to build reading stamina both in class and at home with nightly reading.

Mrs. Banta, Miss Kirby and Mrs. Nardi are proud of their hard-working second graders and look forward to a productive year filled with lots of learning and fun!

Grade 3 – Mrs. Jaime Ricci and Mr. Brian Samples

The Third Graders of Laning Avenue School are excited to start another school year! They came to school ready to take on the responsibilities and learning that is unique to third grade. The start of third grade can be overwhelming due to all of their new books, challenging assignments and the learning of organizational skills. By the middle of October, they will all be in the swing of things and heading towards success.

To kick off the year, we began Reading Workshop. The students have learned the routines and responsibilities that come with such a program and have shown great enthusiasm during reading time. Our first goal has been to build up reading stamina and they are really coming along in this area. In Math, the third graders learned place value through the thousands, comparing number values, counting money, and are beginning to explore rounding. In science, the third graders are excited to start learning about the scientific method and the tools used for experiments throughout the year. In social studies, the third graders the children have begun to learn all about community. We will focus on Verona and learn the history of our great town.

Our third graders are thrilled with some of the new skills they will be learning this year including: writing cursive, learning the multiplication tables, division, and reading workshop. We know that all the third graders at Laning Avenue will have a happy, healthy and successful academic year.

Grade 4 – Mrs. Kristine DePoe and Mrs. Pamela Solomon

The school year is off to a fantastic start and the students have done a terrific job of settling into fourth grade! Classmates got to learn more about one another through our fabulous bio-poems and by sharing summer memories. We have quickly learned that everyone's exceptional personalities and unique interests not only make our students stand out as individuals, but make the fourth grade a great place to learn and grow together.

We were excited to begin our first math unit. Students reviewed addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division through algebraic expression. Students found that by organizing

information in a systematic way they were able to find the rule and use variables to create algebraic expressions.

The students are enjoying our Reading Workshop Program. The fourth graders are thrilled that they will be the ones choosing the books they read this year. We are also excited to start book clubs soon!

Our young authors have already begun brainstorming ideas in Writing Workshop. Students will focus on personal narratives as we start the year. We are looking forward to reading their terrific stories!

In social studies, students have begun to explore the wonderful state of New Jersey. Building on the students experiences, we have discussed places in New Jersey the students have visited. We will look at the New Jersey Regions and identify where each exciting place is located.

Our fourth grade scientists enthusiastically began our first science unit, *Earth's Changing Surfaces*. Students are learning about rocks, minerals, landforms, and fossils. The students were excited to learn there are over 4,000 minerals, but only three types of rocks.

Verona Pre-School Program

Full Day Preschool Teacher – Mrs. Grace Minervo-Buneo

We welcomed a new group of preschoolers to the full day preschool program this September. What a great start we had. For some of the children this is their first experience coming to school. We are so proud of how they adapted to leaving their parents and learning the routine of the school day. It was wonderful meeting all the parents at Back to School Night and sharing information about our program.

Our themes this month included Introduction to School and All about Me!! The children acclimated to all the areas in our classroom and toured our school both inside and outside. We took pictures of the children playing in the various areas so they could look at them and talk about them. It was wonderful to see them exploring the classroom and making choices for desired toys and activities. We concluded our month reading books about how we are alike and how we are different and followed that up with creating large body portraits that we displayed in our hallway. Some of our favorite activities are circle time, story time, sensory time and music and movement time. Here's to a great year with our full day preschoolers!

Preschool – Pauline Jennis and Mary Ann Bifulco

We welcomed our returning students and our new students to the Verona Preschool Program. The preschool children transitioned beautifully to their new classroom experiences, friends and teachers. To start the school year off we covered "Introduction to School", "All About Me" and "My 5 Senses" as our themes. "Introduction to School" was a time for the children to get to know their environment and to feel safe being away from their families (some for the very first time!). We toured the inside of our school, went outside to the playground and learned about the different areas of the classroom.

Our "All About Me" lesson let the children notice how we are the same and how we are different. They learned each other's names and greeted each other during group circle time. They learned about sharing and how our classroom is a family of friends who all learn to play with each other. Books that discussed how we are the same and different supported our discussions. The children

created an “All About Me Book” at home with their parents. They enjoyed talking about their books and showing us the pictures.

As an extension to our “All About Me” theme, we explored our “5 Senses”. The children listened and created their own music with instruments, touched a variety of sensory materials and came up with adjectives to describe what they were feeling (bumpy, soft, sticky, wet etc.) and smelled spices and herbs. We explored how we use our eyes to see everything around us and used visual toys like magnifying glasses and kaleidoscopes. We took listening walks around the school and outside in nature.

Preschool is so much fun and we look forward to new experiences every day.
