Laning Kids Help the Hungry



The Laning Kids Help the Hungry Food Drive will kick off on Monday, October 13, and run through Friday, October 17. Please note: These dates are different than those in the SCA pink book. That's because we want to coordinate our efforts with those of the Junior Woman's Club of Verona, which is organizing a town-wide food drive called Verona Fights Hunger Week.

Here at Laning, our collection process will be the same as always: We will place baskets throughout the building for your donations of non-perishable food items, which will be given to the Human Needs Food Pantry in Montclair. This extraordinary program was first implemented in February 2008 by a Laning mom who found a way for the students to make a difference.

What specifically could they use?

The Human Needs Food Pantry collects any and all non-perishable, non-expired food, such as cereal, pasta, sauce, canned fruits and vegetables, peanut butter, jelly and crackers. In addition, soap and shampoo are helpful donations, as well as brown paper grocery bags. (What a great way to recycle!)

During Verona Fights Hunger Week, local schools, businesses, civic organizations, charities and religious groups will collect donations. On Saturday, October 18, volunteers will bring those donations to Verona Town Hall. The Junior Woman's Club will then transport everything to the Human Needs Food Pantry.

Four percent of Verona's households live below the federal poverty level, according to a recent report published by the United Way of Northern New Jersey. Another 20 percent of households struggle to make ends meet and cannot always afford groceries and other basic necessities. Laning Supermarket Gift Card (SCRIP) Fundraiser

Last year we had just over 50 families and 4 staff members participate in this fundraiser and were able to raise an all-time high of \$6,000. Currently, we have less than 40 families and staff that have signed up to participate this year. We lost quite a few families whose children have moved on to the middle school. Please consider signing up for a monthly amount or even a one-time purchase to boost our profits for the year.

As you know, Laning is always in need of new technology and with your support in this “no-cost” fundraiser we can purchase new equipment for our school. Laning earns 5% on all gift cards purchased through the SCA.

Gift Card Fundraiser Quick Facts:

When you buy gift cards through the Laning SCA, we earn 5% of the total amount sold!!! For example, purchase \$200 in ShopRite cards and the Laning SCA earns \$10. This can really add up!

Buy only what you need! Buy from one store or buy from all four! Change stores or change amounts each time you buy! If you sign up for a monthly commitment but need to skip a month, we can do that too, just let us know.

Here's how it works:

The gift cards work like cash: For example, if you buy \$44 in groceries, use \$50 in gift cards and you still have \$6 on your card for your next shopping trip.

Orders are delivered through your child's backpack: Fill out the order form that can be found on the school's website under backpack flyers and return it in your child's backpack in an envelope marked Supermarket Gift Cards.

If you haven't already signed up for SCRIP or made a one-time purchase this year, please consider doing so in October.

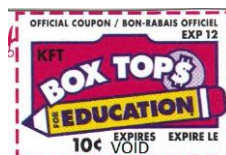

What's Happening in Our Classrooms

Kindergarten – Mrs. Kristy McCabe and Mrs. Kimberley Nochimson

5-4-3-2-1 BLAST OFF! We have another AWESOME group of kindergartners filling up KM and KN this year! We are incredibly proud to say that all of the children are walking down to class all by themselves each morning and quickly adjusting to kindergarten life. ☺ We spent the month of September getting familiar with our school and all of the amazing teachers within it. We are learning all of the important rules to keep us safe and help us be the best we can be each and every day! We played lots of fun games to get to know our fun-loving new classmates. We are realizing that there is so much to learn and that we must always have our listening ears on! We were mathematicians counting everything we could get our hands on! We practiced our fine motor skills with lots of coloring, cutting and gluing. We have been observing the beauty of the change of season as we happily welcomed fall. We also wrote about our favorite things to do in the fall and learned all about the legend of Johnny Appleseed as we celebrated his birthday! We are enjoying Reading and Writing workshop! We have learned our workshop routines and look forward to this special time each day! We have already sketched our very first stories! Each day is a brand new adventure in kindergarten! **We cannot wait to watch our littlest Laning learners grow!**

Grade 1 – Mrs. Nancy Apisa, Mrs. Kristine DePoe, and Mrs. Anne Marie Ruggiero

The first graders are off to a super start at Laning. We have launched ourselves into Reading Workshop and have been learning all about the important workshop procedures that make our classrooms run smoothly. Recently, we read the book, BORN TO READ, by Judy Sierra, and we practiced making connections from our lives to this story. In writing, we are stretching our stories, learning to sketch and label more vigorously during our writing process. The strange sounds emanating from the First Grades are not to be feared but to be encouraged. It is merely the sound of children writing...invented spelling during Writing Workshop is in full swing, and the children are sounding out everything!

We have begun a weekly fluency exercise where we practice reading one poem for several days in order to read more smoothly. It's so exciting! Plus, we've been practicing our handwriting and letter sounds daily.

Through games and manipulatives, the students are building math awareness and math skills. We have already completed our first math topic on understanding addition, and the children have been very busy with subtraction, too. The children are being prepared for the concepts which will be introduced this year.

The school year is off to a great start!

Grade 2 – Mrs. Pamela Banta and Ms. Jennifer Kirby

The second graders were eager to start a new school year and have been adjusting to their new routines. They spent the first week of school getting to know one another through a series of morning meetings and getting to know you activities.

Students spent the first month of school reviewing addition concepts in math and launching their first writing workshop unit. They were very excited to continue writing workshop from first grade! In social studies, students have been learning how to use their new materials, such as atlases and maps. In science, they have been learning how scientists use their five senses to help with investigations. They then put those senses to work in a series of investigations involving pennies.

The newest addition to the second grade curriculum is Reading Workshop. Students learned about who they are as readers and how that impacts their choice in books. They had a great time interviewing a parent at home about their childhood reading memories. They also learned several strategies that readers use to help them understand text. Students are working to build reading stamina both in class and at home with nightly reading.

Mrs. Banta and Ms. Kirby are proud of their hard-working second graders and look forward to a productive year filled with lots of learning and fun!

Grade 3 – Mrs. Sage Nardi, Mrs. Jaime Ricci, and Mr. Brian Samples

The third graders of Laning Avenue School are excited to start another school year! They came to school ready to take on the responsibilities and academic challenges unique to third grade.

We have started off the year reviewing sentences and fragments, as well as some everyday word work through the use of our Foundations program. In Reading Workshop, students have been exposed to a variety of genres while thinking about their “just right” books in new ways and recording important thoughts as they read. Writing Workshop has also launched, and students are doing a wonderful job creating personal narratives about important moments in their lives.

In math, the third graders have focused on place value, rounding, and using addition and subtraction to estimate sums and difference.

In science, the third graders are excited to start learning about the scientific method, inquiry tools for experiments, and the characteristics of living things. We will begin to focus on plant and animal cells and life cycles as we move in to October.

In social studies, our main focuses have been the usage of tools, such as globes, maps, and atlases. We have also spent time getting more acquainted with map features, specifically the map key.

Our third graders are excited to discover the new skills they will be learning about this year across all subjects. We know that all the third graders at Laning Avenue will have a happy, healthy, and successful academic year.

Grade 4 – Mrs. Lesley Carter and Mrs. Pamela Solomon

The school year is off to a fantastic start and the students have done a terrific job of settling into fourth grade! Classmates got to learn more about one another through our fabulous bio-poems and by sharing summer memories. We have quickly learned that everyone’s exceptional personalities and unique interests not only make our students stand out as individuals, but make the fourth grade a great place to learn and grow together.

We were excited to begin our first math unit. Students reviewed the properties of multiplication and practiced mastering their multiplication and division facts.

The students are enjoying our Reading Workshop Program. During reading times, children are exposed to high-quality literature, engage in meaningful conversations about books, and choose their own just right books to read. We are teaching 4th graders to be independent with their choice of books as we foster a love of reading. As part of the workshop model, students get daily mini-

lessons that focus on learning reading skills, followed by 30 to 40 minutes of independent reading. Learn more about this model of learning during Literacy Night on October 28th.

During Writers' Workshop students have begun the launching unit. During this unit, students learn to live like real writers and engage in authentic writing practices. In order to do this work, students set up their own writer's notebook and practice writing daily. We learn strategies that writers use to find stories (our me bags), then, we choose one story to focus on publishing. During this stage, writers work on revising and editing their story. We will soon have our finished narratives!

In social studies, students have begun to explore the wonderful state of New Jersey. Building on the students experiences, we have discussed places in New Jersey the students have visited. We will look at the New Jersey Regions and identify where each exciting place is located.

Our fourth grade scientists enthusiastically began our first science unit, *Earth's Changing Surfaces*. Students are learning about rocks, minerals, landforms, and fossils. The students were fascinated to learn there are over 4,000 minerals, but only three types of rocks.

Verona Pre-School Program

Pauline Jennis, Maryann Bifulco, and Grace Minervo- Buneo

We welcomed our returning students and our new students to the Verona Preschool Program. The preschool children transitioned beautifully to their new classroom experiences, friends and teachers.

To start the school year off we covered "Introduction to School", "All About Me" and My 5 Senses" as our themes. "Introduction to School" was a time for the children to get to know their environment and to feel safe being away from their families (some for the very first time!). We toured the inside of our school, went outside to the playground and walked around the outside of the school.

"All About Me" let the children notice how we are the same and how we are different. They learned each others names and greeted each other during group circle time, they learned the ins and outs of sharing through our free play time, and they learned how they can use classroom materials through our free art and structured art time. Books that discussed how we are the same and different supported our discussions. The children created an "All About Me Book" at home with their parents. They enjoyed talking about their books and showing us the pictures.

As an extension to our "All About Me" theme, we explored our "5 Senses". The children listened and created their own music with instruments, touched a variety of sensory materials and came up with words to describe what they were feeling (bumpy, soft, sticky, wet etc.), smelled spices and herbs, talked about different tastes determining their likes and dislikes and explored how we use our eyes to see everything around us.

The children are beginning to make friends and to look forward to each and every day at the Verona Preschool Program. For language arts they are learning to ask and answer questions about a story, understand concepts of print and the mechanics of reading a book. For math they are learning about shapes, positional concepts, sorting, patterning and measurement.
