NJDOE Graduation Requirements

- 5 credits in Visual & Performing Arts
- 5 credits in 21st Century Life & Careers/Technology

How Verona Currently Executes Requirements:

- Visual & Performing Arts
 - 6 full year performing arts electives (will remain)
 - 7 full year visual arts electives
- 21st Century Life & Careers/Technology
 - 15 full year electives
 - Some offered concurrently in the same class
 - Most have prerequisite requirements which limit student choice



Current vs. New Structure

ANALYSIS OF CURRENT STRUCTURE

- Verona offers fewer electives than all schools in comp group except Cresskill and Cedar Grove
- Verona offers fewest semester offerings in the group
- Prerequisite requirements decrease flexibility in student scheduling

BENEFITS OF NEW STRUCTURE

- Increase student choice in course selection
- Diversify curriculum and the academic experience of our students
- Increased opportunity for student to do advanced level elective work
- Curriculum of new semester courses will be aligned with 2009 Visual & Performing Arts Standards and 2009 21st Century Life & Careers/Technology Standards



Proposed Structure

- Current broad, year long electives will be replaced with more advanced level, refined semester electives:
 - 22 new 2.5 credit semester offerings in 21st Century Life & Careers/Technology
 - o 18 new 2.5 credit semester offerings in Visual & Performing Arts
 - o 3 new technology-based semester offerings in Mathematics
 - 2012-2013 elective courses that will run will be based on student selection during the scheduling process
 - Freshman Seminar will continue to be a required full year course for all 9th grade students
 - Performing Arts offerings (vocal and instrumental offerings) will remain the same

Review of Course Sequence Changes


Impetus for Change:

Social Studies Course Sequence


