Drop-Off & Pick-Up Safety is Our Priority!

- No child should arrive to school before 8:15AM. This is the time at which staff is available to supervise students.
- All K-4 students should enter the building by way of Lanning Road, not Elk Rd. The Elk Road entrance is for pre-school children only.
- When possible, walk to school. This will reduce the number of vehicles in front of our school each morning. If you can't walk please consider carpooling.
- When dropping off students in the morning, please proceed as far forward as possible in your vehicle. This enables more vehicles to fall into line. Children will enter the building at the canopy entrance. Teachers will be in the hallway at 8:15AM to direct children to their classrooms.
- No parking, for any length of time, in spots designated no parking in front of our school.
- Please have students prepared at home so they may exit cars (curbside) in a timely fashion. Remember, sometimes up to 125 vehicles drop off children within a ten minute span. We need to make space for these vehicles.
- Having students walk in between cars during pick up or drop off in the middle of Lanning Road is an unacceptable and dangerous practice.
- If you would like to "see" your child walk in the building, you must park legally and walk your child to the nearest entrance. No parking, for any length of time, in the drop off zone.
- All crossing of Lanning Road should only occur at the corner of Elmwood Rd or Otsego Rd.
- No vehicles should be entering or leaving the school parking lot on Lanning Road at pick-up or drop-off times.
- Children are not permitted to play in and around the side parking lot after dismissal.




