# **Conflict Resolution**

Children in the early years are faced with a number of problems in a typical day. Learning to solve them is a desirable skill to teach children. Solving problems involves critical thinking, which carries over into academic areas as well.

## What we are doing in school: Conflict Resolution

Our students are taught the "Win – Win Guidelines" at school.

- 1. Take time for cooling off if needed. Find alternative ways to express anger.
- 2. Each person states their feelings and the problem as they see it using "I Messages". No blaming, no name calling, no interrupting.
- 3. Each person states the problem as the other person sees it.
- 4. Each person says how they are responsible for the problem.
- 5. Brainstorm solutions together and choose a solution that satisfies both a Win/Win solution.
- 6. Affirm, forgive or thank your partner.

At F.N. Brown school we view problems as opportunities to learn. Helping your child solve problems increases his or her independence. Capable children solve problems effectively. Conflict Resolution began as a school initiative a couple of years ago at our school. We are very proud of our work up to this point and we are viewed as the district pioneers with this approach. A committee of staff members, representing each of the other elementary schools, is currently signed up for the Conflict Resolution training sponsored by the New Jersey State Bar Foundation. This is the same training that our school committee attended. The goal for the other elementary schools this year is to explore, learn and apply this initiative at each Verona elementary school respectively. This is very exciting! FNB will continue to work on this initiative and implement the next phase focused on *Peer Mediation*.

Our Character Education committee spearheading the Conflict Resolution and Peer Mediation approaches is comprised of the following staff members: Mrs. Collins, Mr. Hill, Dr. Lanzo, Mrs. Tully, Mr. Waibel and Ms. Witter.

## How home and school can continue to work together:

You can support problem solving at home by using the steps listed above with your child. In addition, you can help by giving your child space to solve his or her problems wherever possible. Acknowledge when you see your child effectively solving a problem and label it as such. When you

allow your child to solve problems, you are communicating your confidence in his or her abilities and competence.

# ACTIVITIES AT F.N. BROWN SCHOOL

#### MS. PASSAGE'S CLASS

Now that school's in full swing the children have been working diligently each and every day! Everyone enjoyed dressing up for our Halloween parade and festivities!

In Reader's Workshop, the students completed our Reader's Workshop Launching unit where students learned the rules and routines of the workshop model. The students have learned to build stamina, navigate through books, identify and explain details in the illustrations, and how to independently read stories with meaning and purpose. We have just begun our Fiction unit, where the primary focus is to retell using key elements such as character, setting, and plot in a story. The students are so excited to read every day!

In Writer's Workshop, the students are eager to get their thoughts out daily! The first graders have finished their Small Moment unit and now have begun Realistic Fiction. The students have begun creating their very own characters. We are very excited to see what kind of struggles their characters are faced with and how they ultimately solve the problem. The Kindergarteners continue to work on Small Moments. The have worked hard to organize their thoughts to write a story in sequential order. They have learned to add details to their illustrations and label their pictures!

In math, we review basic skills such as identifying numbers, counting 2s, 5s, and10s, counting backward, adding and subtracting 1-more and 2-more than a given number using a number grid. Our first graders continue to build on their addition and subtraction skills by learning new strategies.

We are looking forward to the holidays at F.N. Brown!

## KINDERGARTEN – CATHERINE ORSINI & MICHELE STARANKA

Our students really enjoyed their first FN Brown Thanksgiving Feast! The SCA is one of the wonderful things about FN Brown we are all very thankful for and we appreciate all their work in making the feast so special.

It was nice to see all the kindergarten parents during our conferences. It is a great way to connect and discuss the wonderful accomplishments of our students. Our parents are very supportive and we are thankful for you!

We are moving along quickly in Writing Workshop and are presently creating list books and labeling our illustrations. At the end of each unit, your child will bring home all the work they have created and kept in their writing folders. Please ask them to share their work with you.

The students are so excited to bring home their "just right" baggy books!! Please encourage daily reading and rereading. It will be a great help in building their confidence and allowing them to practice the strategies they are learning.

Please continue reviewing sight word lists every day! The sight words are usually tough to sound out and frequent review helps the students in remembering the words they will use so often when reading and writing.

In Math we have been working on comparing numbers to 10. Please continue to provide assistance during homework and also spend time reviewing numbers to 30.

The children are gearing up for their first FN Brown holiday concert and really enjoy practicing. They are looking forward to dressing up and showcasing their talents for you! Enjoy the holiday season with your families and friends. 2015 – here we come!!

### FIRST GRADE – ANNA COLLINS & ERICA MC KENNA

In November our first graders really began to understand "stamina" in reading and are trying their very best to read independently for twenty minutes. Of course this time is broken up with individual

conferences and guided reading or strategy groups. The students love this time of the day!!! We also started our reading unit focused on non-fiction with its many features. Students are being exposed to features like: table of contents, index, and glossary. Our students need be familiar with the components of a biography, a reference book and a literary non- fiction book.

For math, both classes continue to work on addition and subtraction strategies. Using doubles, near doubles and adding and subtracting (0-1-2) are coming along. The concepts of counting up and counting back are more natural for most of the students. Using a number line is always helpful as is using touch math. The more practice your child gets at home using simple fact flash cards the better the chances are your child will begin to memorize these easier facts then possibly see the relationship when it is time to add and subtract larger numbers between (12-20) later this school year.

Our Small Moments unit in writing was also a success. Each child was asked to pick their favorite small moment to edit and "fancy up" with a partner and with their teacher. These stories were shared at a Writers Celebration. Mrs. McKenna's class read their stories aloud to a Kindergarten class while Mrs. Collins' class read aloud to Mrs. Force's class. The students are starting to become more comfortable with speaking in front of others. The students are learning to pace themselves while they read aloud as well as try to look at their audience, show their illustrations and use expression in their voices. They love speaking into the amplification system so all can hear their works of art.

Parents, thank you again for all you are doing to help your child be a respectful, responsible and resourceful first grader. Keep your child reading and encourage them to continually ask questions.

#### SECOND GRADE – MARIA GRAZIANO & NANCY HISCANO

We hope you had a wonderful Thanksgiving celebrating with good food, family, and friends. We return to school with the holiday season upon us. We can't ignore all of the excitement the children bring to class as they look forward to this special time of year. Therefore, we will be working on a writing unit focused on the traditional tale of the Gingerbread Man. We will be reading various versions of the story, comparing and contrasting story events and characters. We will then use these stories to inspire us to create our own gingerbread story.

In Reading Workshop, we are continuing to grow as we explore our unit on Fiction. Readers have been applying the skills that have been taught in mini-lessons, such as, connections, tone, mood, character traits, and point of view. We are building up our stamina as independent readers with our "Just-Right" books and we have been responding to what we read daily. Small Guided Reading groups meet with teachers to target specific skills to advance fluency and understanding. We are happy to see the excitement the children show toward their reading. We will also take a closer look at series books and explore the same characters as we follow their adventures through different stories.

In Math, we are finishing our topic on Place Value to 100. We have been exploring different ways to express and compare numbers. Manipulatives and games help this topic come alive and make it fun for the learner. Our next topic will be 2-digit addition with regrouping. To help make this concept easier for your child to understand, continue to practice basic facts at home.

Did you hear? We are learning about Sound in Science! Second graders have been conducting experiments to answer questions such as," What causes sound?", "How does sound travel?", and "How do we make different sounds?". Some new vocabulary words discussed are: vibrate, sound, sound wave, loudness, and pitch.

We continue to practice positive behaviors with our Peace Pals in fourth grade. We always look forward to meeting with them every other week. Our last lessons focused on the story of our names and all of the unique things that make us special. We enjoyed sharing in our small groups and we are getting to know each other even better through these activities.

Enjoy the Holiday Season and we will see you in 2015!

## THIRD GRADE – MEGAN PELLEGRINO, KAREN SABATINO AND KIM SAVOLSKIS

As thoughts of turkeys and falling leaves are replaced with visions of sugarplums, third grade students are remaining focused on academic skills.

In Reading Workshop, a unit study on Non-Fiction will be introduced. Students will become familiar with important text features such as titles, subtitles, pictures, and captions, and how they add meaning to the text. They will also learn to identify various types of non-fiction literature about high interest topics. Skills learned in this unit will be easily integrated with our study of Native Americans and Early Communities in Social Studies. The two content areas will complement each other well, as we research and learn about regional differences and ways of life across our country, from early times until present day.

A Life Science unit on types of living things is in progress. Students are learning how scientists classify animals into groups, and sub groups, of vertebrates and invertebrates. We will also learn about life cycles, metamorphosis, heredity factors, and inherited traits. The unit will conclude with a field trip to World of Wings, in January!

Students are achieving a third grade milestone of understanding the concepts of multiplication, and learning their multiplication facts. This is always an exciting lifelong skill to learn. With SMARTBOARD activities, websites, games, catchy rhymes, and apps, learning facts is a breeze! This leaves plenty of brainpower on reserve for the more complex problem solving skills required by Common Core.

Writing Workshop is keeping students engaged through a unit in writing Realistic Fiction stories. Students call upon their imaginations to combine their creative ideas with real life experiences, to develop interesting characters and story lines. Grammar lessons focused on sentence structure and parts of speech are equipping students with editing skills needed to improve the clarity of their writing.

Of course the season would not be complete without discussion of the various holidays and cultural traditions celebrated at this time of year, all of which center around light. Students will explore the differences in these celebrations, while discovering similar themes that link cultures together, as citizens of the world.

We take this opportunity to wish all of our FN Brown families a happy holiday season, and a happy healthy new year ahead!

### FOURTH GRADE – MARY ANN FORCE & LOU WAIBEL

We would like to congratulate our fourth graders on a very successful first marking period. Students have learned many skills and experienced much learning. We are proud of their accomplishments.

In Math students are working on multiplying one-digit times two-digit numbers. They are being asked to apply their basic multiplication facts and studied patterns to find products. Students are also learning how to use algorithms in order to understand how to connect numbers and answers in their place value. They are always reminded that math involves a variety of processes including problem solving, reasoning, communicating, connecting and representing.

We are continuing to write narratives making deeper connections between external actions and internal responses that strengthen their personal narratives. Students are also learning that writers use scenes from the past or future to bring out their thoughts and ideas.

In Science students are continuing our study of the ecosystem. They have learned that ecosystems are complicated systems with many interactions among living and non-living things. We are learning about the role of living things and how energy transfer and interacts. The fourth grade field trip to the Sterling Mineral was a huge success. Exploring an authentic mine offered the perfect experience in the exploration of the many minerals that blend to form rocks of different colors and patterns. By the way, this is a great way for a family to spend an enjoyable day ay the mines. They are open on Saturdays.

In Social Studies, our students will begin learning about how New Jersey came to be settled by nomads, Native Americans and Europeans. They will discuss the cultural differences between them all and the affect each culture had on the other.

#### <u>SPANISH – LUISA WITTER</u>

Hola de la clase de español! Hello from Spanish class! I am very proud of all the students for using as much español as they can! They are off to an excelente start as we begin the second marking

period! First grade students have been continuing to practice greetings in class through songs, chants, and verbal practice. Students have begun a unit on colors in Spanish and are expressing in Spanish whether they like or dislike a color (Si me gusta or No me gusta). I encourage you to have your child practice as much español as they can by sharing what they have done in class or identifying colors in Spanish or answering Si me gusta or No me gusta when describing likes/dislikes at home.

Second grade students are continuing to practice conversational Spanish with each other with greetings asking and answering Cómo te llamas and Cómo estás. Encourage your child to answer Cómo estás in Spanish by answering the many ways we have learned in class. Some include Muy bien, Tengo hambre, and Tengo sueño. Students have also begun a unit on numbers up to twenty in Spanish through chants, verbal practice, written practice, and games. Please have your child practice counting up to 20 in Spanish.

Third grade students have continued learning the differences of greeting someone their age as opposed to an adult. Encourage students to ask Como esta Usted when asking how you are feeling and Como estas to someone their age. Students may answer the many ways we have learned to answer including Tengo frio, Tengo hambre, Muy bien, Estoy feliz, etc. Students have just completed their technology projects for Hispanic Heritage project and are in the process of sharing them with class. The projects came out fabuloso!

Fourth grade students have begun a unit on time in Spanish. Encourage your child to tell the time in Spanish to the hour and half hour by asking them ¿Qué hora es? and answering the time in Spanish (i.e. Son las dos or Son las tres y media). Fourth grade students are doing terrific incorporating Spanish with the daily announcements! Students also did a terrific job with their Spanish scavenger hunts to realize the importance the Spanish language has in our society today. Muchas gracias!

#### **INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC – MAX MORDEN**

Band students have been discussing what makes a good concert. Our stage presence has been talked about a great deal as has the need for individual practice. Ask them some of their favorite answers to this topic.

For our first concert, everyone is working on these songs: *Hot Cross Buns, Au Claire de la Lune, Mary Had a Little Lamb, Lightly Row, Mad Dogs, Good King Wenceslas, & Jingle Bells.* Hopefully you are hearing (and recognizing) them often. We will also have various solo and duet performances. As always, the students are very excited and we look forward to our first performance.

## **RESOURCE ROOM – SARI SANTORO**

The Resource Center has been very busy since September. We are back in our old location and we are enjoying all the space of the classroom. Reading workshop lessons have focused on understanding that reading is more than reading words off a page; reading is also thinking! We have been practicing thinking about reading by making connections, inferring and asking questions about our reading. Reading involves a lot of skills and we are learning about these skills with wordless picture book, art, music and text. The students have been very engaged with these lessons and have shown their understanding of these skills while enjoying some interesting books, pictures and songs.

In math, we have looked at the three of the four operations; addition, subtraction, and multiplication. The students have reviewed place value, rounding and the applicable properties. The Smartboard and Elmo have been wonderful tools to help the students make sense of all of these topics. Brain Pop Jr. has also been a part of our instructions. Thanks to all for providing us with these great tools for learning!

# **SPEECH – GILLIAN ALDWORTH**

Students are having fun working on their articulation and learning fall vocabulary. Students requiring development in pragmatic language continue to work on "social thinking" skills, which will help them to be better communication partners. We are always working on building stronger social skills and peer interaction through game play. Siblings and parents are great speech models for students! Students are learning to ask questions and make appropriate comments in order to improve the quality of their peer interactions. We have had fun learning about prepositions and sentence structure using a silly turkey version of "Guess Who". Reading stories and discussing holiday movies are a great way to develop stronger language skills. You can discuss the main idea, favorite characters, the sequence of the story, the major problem and how it was solved! Have a wonderful holiday season with family and friends!
