6th Grade

It is hard to believe that 6th grade is coming to an end. This year the sixth grade worked extremely hard.

In literacy, the students finished a unit on Folklore. Students learned how folklore originated. The students studied a variety of folktales while connecting to the country they originated. This unit lends itself to a spring-board for their 7th grade social studies world culture curriculum.



For example, classes learned the structure of five paragraph essays and wrote different types of essays including argumentative and expository. Students spent time reviewing how to answer reading questions and citing evidence to support their response. Children continued reading independently in class and with Battle Books.

All of the sixth grade students completed reading the novel *Maniac Magee*. Through this novel, the students enhanced their knowledge of reading strategies and figurative language. This novel helped students to understand social problems and how they affect society. Students were actively engaged in this novel, and really enjoyed it.

Finally, the 6th grade will be going on our annual field trip to the Museum of Natural History. This field trip will take place on Monday, June 13th. The students will be engaged in a scavenger hunt activity and experience the feature movie presentation at the museum.

While at Rutgers, the students were thrilled to learn that they had been chosen as the winners of the statewide competition, which was a huge accomplishment considering they were one of only two middle schools involved. 
Harlem Wizards and Jump Rope for Heart: Huge Successes!
