Please do research and choose any six topics to present. Your work will be presented both in English and Chinese (you can use google translation tool). Please list the Chinese keywords you use under each question.

Topics

- Choose ONE form of Chinese arts or crafts (e.g. brush painting, musical instruments, pottery, embroidery, etc). In your writing, describe this art or craft form in detail and explain its significance.
- Choose one of your favorite Chinese foods. In your writing, describe it in detail, and then
 compare and contrast Chinese cuisine (Cantonese, Sichuan, Shandong cuisine, etc.)
 with that of another culture.
- 3. Auspicious Chinese symbols (e.g. peony flower, dragon, pixiu, etc.) are often found in Chinese business establishment such as restaurants, markets, and shops. Choose and describe one or two of such symbols and state where they would be seen. In your writing, explain the cultural significance of those symbols.
- Choose ONE ancient Chinese invention (e.g. paper making, movable type printing, the compass, etc.). In your writing, describe this invention in detail and explain its significance.

- 5. hoose ONE form of Chinese performing arts (Beijing Opera, acrobatics, martial arts, etc.). In your writing, describe this art form in detail and explain its significance.
- 6. Choose ONE aspect of Chinese family relationships (husband and wife, parents and children, etc.). In your writing, describe the relationship and discuss traditional Chinese values embodied in this relationship.
- 7. Choose ONE well-known Chinese historical or contemporary structure that you are familiar with (the Forbidden City, the Great Wall of China, the Bird's Nest, etc.). In your writing, describe this structure and explain its significance.
