Verona Announces Its First Google Teacher Academy

The Verona Public Schools is proud to announce its first Google Teacher Academy for the 2015-16 school year! "We had over forty teachers apply for this exciting opportunity to enhance their classroom instruction," states Rui Dionisio, Superintendent of Schools. Administrative Team spent a considerable amount of time figuring out who should be on the Google Team next year. The process included creating a district overview (elementary, middle, and high school) to gain a global view of who was interested. Additionally, grade level, content areas, and departments were all factors in determining who was placed on the Google Team. "The goal for our Google Teacher Academy is to build capacity with as many teachers in as many subjects/areas as possible", noted Charlie Miller, Director of Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment. The teachers who were selected range in teaching experience and span the entire district.

Brown. **Ms. Joan Weiss**, a grade 1 teacher will represent Forest Avenue School. **Mr. Brian Samples**, a grade 3 teacher at Laning, will lead Laning Avenue School. Both elementary librarian/media specialists, **Ms. Corisa Walker** and **Ms. Katey McAuliffe**, will support all of our classroom teachers in every district elementary school to maximize Google Apps for Education (GAFE) ¹.

At H.B. Whitehorne (HBW) Middle School, Ms. Sarah O'Connor will represent grade 5 and mathematics. In grade 6, Ms. Marissa Albano will teach science, and Ms. Jessica Barnes will represent special education. Mr. Pete Foster will represent grade 7 with Social Studies along with Ms. Kirpa Chohan, one of our grade 7 mathematics/pre-algebra teachers. In grade 8, our science teachers, Ms. Amy Heckel and Mr. Paul Moschella, will work together collaboratively to maximize the latest technology to excite their students. Lastly, Ms. Jen Kleinknecht, HBW's library/media specialist and Computer Science teacher, Mr. Andor Kish will stretch Google to its limits!

At Verona High School (VHS), the Administrative Team ensured that all of the core disciplines were represented. **Dr. Marie Meyer**, teacher of AP Language and Composition as well as English 11 Honors, will represent English Language Arts. In mathematics (Algebra & Geometry), **Mr. Jon Thai** will infuse technology into his classroom instruction. **Mr. Patrick Bresnan** will utilize Google Apps for Education in his US History I & II classes next year. AP & Honors Biology teacher, **Mr. Casey Harris** was selected for science. **Ms. Jessica Calvo** will maximize her opportunities to use Google with her students in Spanish IV Honors and AP Spanish. Two of our special education teachers, **Ms. Jennifer Errico** and **Mr. Matt Swajkowski**, will work with our students to help them reach their fullest potential. Finally, our newly hired librarian/media specialist, **Ms. Maria Benz**, will support the high school teachers with Google as well as vertically articulate GAFE with her elementary and middle school media specialist colleagues.
